How does a Virtual Legal Advice Clinic work?

Volunteer attorneys 1) <u>register with Online TN Justice</u>, 2) select a question to answer, and 3) guide law students through how to answer the question. Law students give feedback and the attorney volunteer submits the answer to the low-income Tennessean. Volunteer attorneys get the opportunity to participate in pro bono and collaborate with law students. Students get to network with attorneys and take on genuine issues under the supervision of a licensed Tennessee attorney. Besides real word experience, both volunteer attorneys' and law students' service

qualifies for pro bono recognition from the Tennessee Supreme Court and Tennessee Bar Association recognition programs. Volunteer attorneys can also earn CLE credit for their time.
